A. What is the best title for this text ?

(1 pt)

Morocco's Booming Aerospace Industry

The text discusses the growth, development, and future of Morocco's aerospace sector — the title must reflect this central theme.

B — Reference questions (2 pts)

B-1. What does the figure 38% in the text refer to ?

(1 pt)

The percentage of the workforce that is **highly qualified**, thanks to diverse training programs.

Reference : Paragraph 2 — “More than 38% of the workforce is now highly qualified.”

B-2. What does the year 2026 refer to in the text ?

(1 pt)

The year **King Mohammed VI launched the establishment of a new Safran Group factory** in Nouaceur.

Reference : Paragraph 3 — “In February, 2026, King Mohammed VI launched...”

C — True or False (3 pts)

C-1. The aerospace industry in Morocco started before 2024.

(1 pt)

TRUE — “over the past two decades” (Paragraph 1) indicates the industry started well before 2024.

C-2. The Institute of Aeronautical Professions is an international training institution.

(1 pt)

FALSE — It is described as a “local, specialized training institution” (Paragraph 2), not international.

C-3. The majority of Safran's employees are men.

(1 pt)

FALSE — “70% of the employees are women” (Paragraph 3).

D — Answer questions (3 pts)

D-1. What will the new Safran factory in Nouaceur produce? (1 pt)

Aircraft landing gear systems.

Reference : Paragraph 3 — “The factory is specialized in producing aircraft landing gear systems.”

D-2. What will help Safran meet the growing global demand? (1 pt)

The strategic location of Morocco.

Reference : Paragraph 4 — “The strategic location of Morocco will allow Safran to meet growing global demand.”

D-3. How does Morocco reduce its dependence on traditional sectors? (1 pt)

By developing a network of high-technology industries, including the aerospace sector.

Reference : Paragraph 5 — “Morocco is developing a network of high-technology industries.”

Grammar, vocabulary, and communicative tasks

A — Word formation (2 pts)

A. Give the correct form of the words in brackets.

(2 pts)

The ministry is working in **collaboration** with **regional** organizations.

collaborate → **collaboration** (verb → noun : add -tion)
region → **regional** (noun → adjective : add -al)

B — Error correction (3 pts)

B-1. The player which scored the first goal...

(1 pt)

who — Use *who* for people, not *which* (which is for things/animals).

B-2. I wish I have a visa...

(1 pt)

had — After *wish*, use the past simple to express an unreal present situation.

B-3. ...will have grew significantly...

(1 pt)

grown — Future perfect requires : *will have* + **past participle** (grow → grew → grown).

C — Gap fill (2 pts)

C. Fill in the blanks with the correct words from the list : *leadership*, *contribution*, *empowerment*, *stereotypes*, *emancipation*.

(2 pts)

stereotypes, leadership

D — Rewriting (4 pts)

D-1. Passive voice : *The committee chose the best story writer...*

(1 pt)

The best story writer **was chosen by the committee** in the storytelling competition.

Active → Passive : Object becomes subject + was/were + past participle + by + agent.

D-2. Reported speech : *"The GPS navigation app saved me a lot of time," said Brahim.* (1 pt)

Brahim said (that) the GPS navigation app **had saved him** a lot of time.

*saved → had saved (backshift : past simple → past perfect)
me → him (pronoun change)*

D-3. Conditional : *The hotel closed down because there weren't many tourists...*

(1 pt)

If there **had been** many tourists visiting the city, the hotel **wouldn't have closed down**.

Third conditional (past unreal) : If + past perfect, would + have + past participle.

D-4. Join using "although" : *The athlete had a leg injury. Still, he won the championship.* (1 pt)

Although the athlete had a leg injury, he won the championship.

E — Appropriate responses (2 pts)

E-1. Customer : *I'm not happy with the quality of the transport provided.*

(1 pt)

Travel agent : **We'll take care of it.**

A professional response acknowledging the complaint and offering to resolve it.

E-2. You : *Robots will replace humans in doing some health care tasks.*

(1 pt)

Friend : **Absolutely !**

Expressing strong agreement with the statement.

F — Completing exchanges (2 pts)

F-1. Friend : *Could you share the photos in the WhatsApp group ?*

(1 pt)

You : **Sure, I'll share them right away.**

F-2. Malika : *Guess what ? Next Saturday is my birthday.*

(1 pt)

Friend : **Happy birthday in advance ! Are you planning a party ?**

Paragraph opening and formal email format

1. Which is the best opening for a paragraph about starting your own business? (1 pt)

This is the best opening because it : (1) introduces the topic clearly, (2) states a personal plan, and (3) gives a reason — essential elements of a good topic sentence.

2. Formal email — greeting and closing. (1 pt)

Dear Sir/Madam ... Yours faithfully

Dear Sir/Madam is used when the recipient’s name is unknown.

Yours faithfully is the matching formal closing.

Note : Yours sincerely is used when the recipient’s name is known (Dear Mr./Mrs. X).

Model Answer — Formal Email (8 pts)

Subject : Challenges Facing School Clubs and Suggested Solutions

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to bring to your attention some challenges that school clubs are currently facing, and to suggest possible solutions.

First of all, many clubs suffer from a lack of funding. For example, the Science Club has not been able to buy new equipment for experiments this year. Similarly, the English Club cannot afford to subscribe to online learning platforms that would help students improve their language skills. Key elements of a strong formal email :

- **Subject line** — clear and specific
- **Greeting** — Dear Sir/Madam (name unknown) or Dear Mr./Mrs. X
- **Introduction** — state the purpose clearly
- **Body** — organized paragraphs with examples and linking words (First of all, In addition, Furthermore, As a result)
- **Suggestions** — propose concrete solutions
- **Conclusion** — express hope and thank the reader
- **Closing** — Yours faithfully (matches Dear Sir/Madam)
- **Language** — formal register, no contractions (I am not I'm), no slang
- **Length** — 200–300 words is ideal for the Bac

- **Topic sentence** — introduces the main idea clearly
- **Supporting details** — examples, reasons, personal experience
- **Linking words** — Specifically, The reason behind, However, In my opinion, In conclusion
- **Coherence** — ideas flow logically from one to the next
- **Conclusion** — restates the main idea or gives a final thought
- **Vocabulary** — varied and appropriate (affordable, reliable, determination, obstacles)
- **Grammar** — correct tenses, subject-verb agreement, no fragments
